Congregational Meeting May 19, 2024









Lectionary Class




Join this class, led by Jason Swartley, as they delve deeper into the Old Testament, Psalm, New Testament, and Gospel readings appointed for each Sunday.




Prayer Shawl Ministry



Do you enjoy knitting or crocheting? If so, why not bless others with your talents by making prayer shawls! Every other Monday from 1:00 –





March 2024 Immanuel LC in Manhattan had a welcomed 41 experience. Several years

(5+) ago Immanuel LC, Missouri Synod faithfully followed their constitution and had a strong vote to leave the ELCA but the Metro-NY Synod refused to release it. Once a land developer make Immanuel an offer to improve but preserve the church location, the synod became involved. Ultimately the situation went to court after a nasty battle over land value and ownership causing devastating personal and corporate attacks Immanuel congregation. Acknowledging the congregation's perseverance has paid off during this incredibly hard time, Pastor Gregory Fryer (NALC) wrote:

"We believed that God was at work in these times of trial, and we calmly carried on. We worshiped with quiet and undistracted minds. We supported our congregation with our time, our talents, and our treasure. We kept everything going, doing the best we could, and entrusting ourselves to God in Christ Jesus."

In time the synod released the congregation and its assets. Immanuel decided that accepting their offer was the best course of action.

"Now we are free to press on, to work at the upbuilding of Immanuel Lutheran Church. Our aim is that our traditional congregation should flourish in Manhattan for centuries to come!"

Sunday Worship always an Easter celebration!



What was it like for Jesus right before His crucifixion? He knew it would not be an easy death. The image of the cross must have haunted His thoughts and filled Him with fear. No wonder Jesus prayed in the Garden “Father, everything is possible for you. Take this cup from me” (Mark 14:36).

But there’s one thing that makes His prayer different from all the panicky prayers we say when we’re scared out of our wits. Jesus added, “Yet not what I will, but what you will”. Jesus desperately wanted to escape and yet He said to God, “Go ahead and let it happen if that’s Your will”. Why?
