### ST. TIMOTHY LUTHERAN CHURCH



"Until now we have sojourned in Passion Week and rightly celebrated Good Friday. Now we come to the resurrection of Christ, to the day of Easter. After man has become thus aware of his sin and terrified in his heart, he must watch that sin does not remain in his conscience, for this would lead to sheer despair."

During the month of May, those of us going on the Mission Trip to North Carolina will be collecting items to make up Disaster Relief Health Kits.

Where we are going, Burnsville, located in Yancy County, has a population of 11,000. Of those, 6,000 have applied for help from FEMA. The people in this community have lost their homes completely and are beginning from scratch.

The mission team will be doing finishing work on the new homes that are being built. Many of these flood victims are still living in tents and temporary shelters, which is why the need for Health Kits is so great. A complete Health Kit includes the following items: bath towel, wash cloth, deodorant, shampoo, toothbrush, toothbrush, bar soap in original wrapping, dental floss, nail clipper and comb. Complete kits or single items are appreciated.

We are also looking for donations of blankets, Bibles, devotionals (for all ages). Please deposit any items in the conference room, in the tub marked "Health Kit Items" during normal church hours by May 31, or on Saturday, May 10 and May 31 from 9am-3pm. If you wish to help with collection/drop off days or have questions, they can be directed to Deb Stein or Jen Conrad.


### **Updated VBS article below:**


#### WOULD YOU LIKE TO BE A COUNTER?
