
Red Cart Library


PRAYER Does It Make Any Difference?



Shepherding Care thoughts ... Believers who study!

Studying the life and teachings of Jesus, the Word of God made flesh, was an important function of the early church. In his various epistles, the Apostle Paul emphasizes the need to teach and learn, to edify and be edified, to nurture and to grow. The purpose for study and learning within the church is for the building up of others and for the mission of outreach to those who do not yet believe.

Consider these verses from Ephesians 4:11 - 16:



"11 And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, 12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, 13 until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, 14 so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful

schemes. ¹⁵ Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, ¹⁶ from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love."

Consider these questions:

- In order to fill the whole universe, the ascended Jesus gives to various believers the abilities and responsibilities that are needed to fulfill which essential roles within a congregation? (v. 11)
- For what purpose are these roles to be performed? (v. 12a)
- For what purpose do believers need to be so prepared? (v. 12b)
- When will these roles no longer be needed to prepare individual believers and build up the congregation? (v. 13)
- Until our complete maturity is attained in heaven by God's grace, each individual believer is a spiritual infant that is easily swayed by what? (v. 14)
- God's way for us to counter this spiritual tendency is to bring us together into a congregation (body) where we speak what? In what manner? (v. 15a)
- When we do this, what will occur? (v.15b)
- When every member is speaking the truth in love and performing their distinctive function, what happens to the congregation (body)? (v. 16)

May your daily study of God's Word give rise to an overflowing joy of the Lord and an eagerness to share that joy with others!
