


October 27th- Germanfest Potluck and Luther's Pigtails

From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Friends,

It is easy to get confused about the purpose of the church in today's age of information, when rapid change muddles our understanding of human needs and desires.

But Martin Luther in the 1500's also faced changing times and the purpose of the church was not clear, and misunderstood by many. During the Reformation movement, Luther had one very memorable teaching to keep the church clear on its mission. It was the idea of "Mother Church."

The Church by the Spirit's power gives birth and raise children who trust in Jesus Christ. Luther wrote, "The Spirit first leads us into his holy community, placing us in the church's lap, where he preaches to us and brings us to Christ." In this way, the church is the "mother" who begets each Christian through the proclamation of the Word (oxfordre.com). Martin Luther wrote simply about the church in the Large Catechism, "the mother that conceives and bears every Christian through God's Word."

The Holy Spirit works to create and nurture children of God with the mothering and fathering of faith in Jesus Christ, embarking upon the restoration of the world to God. What better purpose of a life can there be than to see brothers and sisters born into the hope and love of the family of God?

I rejoice in this work and hope you do to, as it is joyous and holy work to see faith born among the people of this world that cannot hold on to hope and love.

Rejoice with me and all the brothers and sisters who are joining in on the work of the Holy Spirit's. Especially this past month, we thanked God for a few brothers who have uniquely given time and talent, Chuck Irvin, Scott Deibel—for the third big renovation of our property and for Al Kerchner—who has been with St. Tim for 40 plus years serving the treasury of St. Timothy.

Let me know how this month you are joining Jesus in the work that is uniquely for you the baptized, the joy of joining the mother/fathering of faith among people. Blessed be the Mother Church!


Red Cart Library


Encounters With Jesus


