# \*BRIEF ORDER FOR CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

The Ten Commandments and responses from Martin Luther's explanations in the Small Catechism.

- P As we are baptized, so we die to sin and rise to new life. In the name of the Father, and of + the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen
- P Hear the Word of God. The 1st Commandment: *I am the Lord your God. You shall have no other gods*.
- C We must fear, love, and trust God more than anything else.
- P The 2nd Commandment: You shall not take the name of the Lord Your God in vain.
- C We must fear and love God, so that we do not use his name to curse, swear, lie, deceive, or try to use magical powers. We must speak his name to pray, praise, and thank him in all times of trouble.
- P The 3rd Commandment: *Remember the Lord's Day, to keep it holy.*
- C We must fear and love God, so that we do not look down on the preaching of God's Word. We must treat it as holy and gladly listen and learn it.
- P The 4th Commandment: *Honor your father and mother*.
- C We must fear and love God, so that we do not look down on or irritate our parents and other authorities. We must respect, serve, obey, and love them.
- P The 5th Commandment: You shall not kill.
- C We must fear and love God, so that we do not harm our neighbors. We must protect and help them in every need.

- P The 6th Commandment: You shall not commit adultery.
- C We must fear and love God, so that our words and actions are clean and decent in matters of sex. Husbands and wives must honor and serve each other.
- P The 7th Commandment: You shall not steal.
- C We must fear and love God, so that we do not take our neighbors' money or possessions, or try to cheat them. We must help our neighbors to protect their possessions and employment.
- P The 8th Commandment: You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
- C We must fear and love God, so that we do not hurt our neighbors by lying, betraying, or slandering them. We must defend them, say good things about them, and explain what they do in the best possible way.
- P The 9th Commandment: You shall not covet your neighbor's house.
- C We must fear and love God, so that we do not envy or try to take our neighbors' house, property, or personal belongings, or claim to have a right to them. We must help our neighbors to keep what belongs to them.
- P The 10th Commandment: You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse, family, friends, or workers.
- C We must fear and love God, so that we do not envy or interfere in our neighbors' relationships. We must urge them to stay and be loyal.


- P What does God say to us about all these commandments?
- C God threatens to punish everyone who breaks these commandments. We should be afraid of his anger, because of his righteousness and not violate his commandments. But God promises grace and every blessing to those who keep his commandments. For this reason, too, we should love and trust God, and willingly obey his commandments.
- P Let us return to God with all our hearts and confess our sins.
- C Almighty and merciful God, we confess that we are not worthy to gather in your presence and be called your children. Because of us, your name is dishonored in the world, and we rightly fear your judgment. We pray for forgiveness we cannot earn and renewal we do not merit. Deliver us from slavery to sin and death, so that we may delight in your commandments, through the merits of Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord. Amen.
- Our Father in heaven has given his only Son to die and to rise from the dead for us. For Jesus' sake, he pardons all our sins and calls us to serve him in the world as his forgiven family. Our Father sets us free in the Holy Spirit to fear, love, and trust him more than anything else, and gladly to obey his commandments. On the Last Day, he will raise us, and all who believe in Christ, and we shall live forever under him in his kingdom in righteousness, innocence, and blessedness.

By Christ's authority I forgive you all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of **★** the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.



Luke 13:1-9

- P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the thirteenth chapter.
- C Glory to you, O Lord.

<sup>1</sup>There were some present at that very time who told {Jesus} about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. <sup>2</sup>And he answered them, "Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans, because they suffered in this way? <sup>3</sup>No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish. <sup>4</sup>Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them: do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others who lived in Jerusalem? <sup>5</sup>No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish." <sup>6</sup>And he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. <sup>7</sup>And he said to the vinedresser, 'Look, for three years now I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and I find none. Cut it down. Why should it use up the ground?' <sup>8</sup>And he answered him, 'Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig around it and put on manure. <sup>9</sup>Then if it should bear fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.'"

# What is a Disciple?"

Luke 6:37-42 | Use Chapter 9 Video 4

#### Luke 6:37-42

<sup>37</sup> "Do not judge, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven. <sup>38</sup> Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you."

<sup>39</sup> He also told them this parable: "Can the blind lead the blind? Will they not both fall into a pit? <sup>40</sup> **The student is not above the teacher, but everyone who is fully trained will be like their teacher.** 

<sup>41</sup>"Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? <sup>42</sup> How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me take the speck out of your eye,' when you yourself fail to see the plank in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye.
